Dear Readers of ECFA-Journal.

Both major meeting points on media for children are on the move this year. AGORA, for many years held in Greece, was organized in Bologna/Italy this year. ECFA's Kid'Screen will be in Oslo after many years of being in the Italian Regione Lombardia.

Also, in Northern Europe Kid'Screen's theme is more than up-to date. While the different media branches – cinema, television, computers, video games or

information, communication, entertainment – grow together, it is high time to take a look at this process from cultural, artistic and educational points of view.

We are still at the beginning of massive changes: It had never been so easy for children to make their own films. At the other end of the spectrum especially children have never been so completely surrounded by the media

industries that use all kinds of means to conquer the children's interests.

In the middle, between these examples is the film and media culture for children, an area which sometimes seems to be more and more in danger. Kid'Screen 2003 is a great opportunity to make up our minds about the new challenges of the media industry and to exchange our ideas on how to use the new possibilities available. RTS

AGORA 2003, for the first time not held in Greece, but in Bologna/Italy, again was an important meeting point for all who are professionally involved in quality films and TV-programming for young people. Film and media producers, distributors, festival organisers, researchers and teachers, all found a valuable venue for discussions, networking, learning and gaining new experience and understanding.

For the first time the Kids for Kids Festival at AGORA was co-organized by ECFA and CIFEJ. Exactly 327 films made by children or young people from all over the world were entered. After a pre-selection 50 of these films were presented in Bologna. Many of the young film makers were invited and attended the screenings, some of them even received awards in four categories and two age groups.

Since January 2002, she is assistant to the artistic director of the Olympia International Film Festival for Children and Young People, Dimitris Spirou. In February 2003 Dimitra Gerardi was elected on the board of ECFA.

Neaniko Plano is a non-profit company which was established in 1991 by a creative team of people specialising in the fields of education, cinema, art and theatre, aiming mainly at the development of audiovisual communication and self-expression of young people. In 1997, Neaniko Plano created a Festival, unique in its kind in Greece with a special artistic profile, philosophy and educational dimension: the Olympia International Film Festival for Children and Young People (OIFFfCYP).

OIFFfCYP is the meeting point for film culture for children and young people in Greece.

The festival brings high quality films from all over the world to the Greek audience, acgainting the young audience in this way with the breath of the world's cinematography and creating a future cinema audience with a critical thinking and aesthetic culture. Furthermore, the festival, of course, is also well-known for its wonderful atmosphere of friendship and campanionship amongst all cinematographers in the world

For two years now OIFFfCYP also organizes "Camera Zizanio", the European meeting of young people's audiovisual creations. About 100 young film makers from all over Europe presented their works there during the last session.

But the Olympia Festival and NEANIKO PLANO has also expanded in different directions and became the centre of film culture for young people in Greece: Neaniko Plano produces one film for children and/or young people per year - in cooperation with the Greek Film Centre and the National Televison

Neaniko Plano organizes educational programs, does research and presentations on the history of cinema for children and young people in Greece and has published the book "Children in Greek Cinema".

Neaniko Plano distributes high quality films for children in Greece and - since 2002 acquired the Philip-Theatre in Athens and created a cinema hall specialising in films for children and young people.

The 6th Olympia International Film Festival for Children and Young People will take place from December, 6th to 13th, 2003 in Pyrgos, while parallel events will be held in Ancient Olympia and other cities of the Eleia province.
